As the film begins, we see a (**plume blanche**) flying in a blue sky. As it continues, we also see (**la ligne d'horizon d'une ville**). The feather (**finale**) comes to rest at the feet of Forrest Gump. He (**ramasse**) the feather, opens (**sa valise**) and puts the feather inside a children's book. A bus pulls up, and Forrest continues (**à rester assis tranquillement**) A nurse comes and sits (**sur le banc**) beside him, and (**il se présente**) : "Hello. My name is Forrest, Forrest Gump." He offers the woman a chocolate and (**lui raconte**) that his mama always said, "Life is like a box of chocolates. (**Tu ne sais jamais**) what you're going to get." He then tries to talk to her about (**à quel point...confortable**) her shoes must be. He tells her that his mama always said, "There's an awful lot you can tell about a person by their shoes. Where they're going; (**où ils sont allés**) " He tells the woman that he's worn (**beaucoup de chaussures**) in his life.. - Forrest Gump is (**inhabituel**) young man. As a boy, he has a low IQ and wouldn't have been (**autorisé**) in school had his mother not slept with the (**directeur de l'école**). He has braces on his legs, and the doctor (**ne s'attend pas à ce qu'il soit...**) to be normal. Although there seems to be (**peu d'espoir**) for Forrest, his mother is always encouraging him to be (**qui il veut**) to be. Forrest learns (**à courir**), and so he gets a scholarship to college. Forrest does not seem (**se faire du souci**) many things, but when he is given a job, he (**le fait bien**). He is (**couronné de succès**) on the football team, (**dans l'armée**), on the ping-pong team, and as a captain of a shrimp boat. Is Forrest's life (**bête chance aveugle**) or destiny? Throughout the film, Forrest (**répète**) his mother's saying, "Life is like a box of chocolates - you never know what (**tu obtiendras**)." (**les événements**) in Forrest's life are often at random, and they are (**les deux**) good and bad. Although Forrest's life is interesting, it is not always (**facile et heureuse**). Forrest (**travaille dur**) in everything he does, and he ends up doing (**beaucoup de choses intéressantes**) simply by chance. Forrest meets Jenny one morning only because (**personne d'autre**) will let him sit with them on the bus. He ends up playing ping-pong in China, (**parce que**) he gets (**blessé au combat**) and learns to play in the hospital. Forrest opens a shrimping company that becomes a multimillion dollar company in order (**garder une promesse**) to a friend. Forrest finds the American Dream without even seeming (**chercher**) it. Instead, the American Dream (**lui tomber entre les mains**) as he goes along. As the film (**saute**) from scene to scene, Forrest and Jenny are generally the only people (**qui restent**) Because they constantly run into (**l'autre**), the viewer feels that they have (**un destin**) to be with each other. The events in Forrest's life overlap with (**beaucoup d'évènements historiques importants**) .
