Why do elephants paint their toe nails red? – *So they can hide in cherry trees.* *toe nails: ongles de pied*

**What's a ghost's favourite dessert? –**  
*Ice scream.*  
*scream: cri, crier*



Why are goldfish red? – *Because the water makes them rusty.*  
*Rusty: rouillé*

What's the difference between a dog and a flea? – *A dog can have fleas, but a flea can't have dogs.* *flea: puce*

Why did Robin Hood steal from the rich? - *Because the poor had no money.*

How many feet are there in a yard? – *It depends on how many people are in the yard.* *yard: mesure de longueur (90 cm) et aussi, court.*

What's grey, has a trunk and four legs? – *A mouse going on holiday.* *trunk: tronc et malle*

What's brown, and furry, and has a trunk? *A mouse coming back from holiday.*
