

## 15.1. SOME or ANY (etwas, einige; kein, keine)

„some“ steht in bejahenden Sätzen. „any“ steht in fragenden oder verneinten Sätzen.

There are ...**some**... flowers in the garden. - There aren't ..... people in the street. - ..... shops are closed. - I hope there isn't ..... bad news. – Can you find ..... mushrooms in the woods? - ..... people like mushrooms very much. - I always buy ..... crackers for lunch. – I can see ..... stars in the sky. – Can you see ..... shooting stars (Sternschnuppen)? Are there ..... tickets left? Ron usually finds ..... coins on the beach.

## 15.2. WHY...? BECAUSE....

Look at these sentences: Mrs Carpe buys a spade. She is going to plant a tree.  
...**Why does Mrs Carpe buy a spade?** – **Because she is going to plant a tree.**
