Many children believe that monsters hide in their closets and under their beds, waiting to attack them during the night. Children scared of monsters often call to their parents. Many parents, faced with their frightened child, go to the closet or bend down to the floor to command the “monsters” to leave their children alone. Imagine the surprise of the child when his parents confirm that indeed there are monsters lurking about. Parents may think they are being cute or lessening their child’s fears when they pretend to banish the monsters, but what they really do is worsening the fear. Experts say that in this situation, parents should assure their children that monster don’t exist.
